Autumn Term Homework 2019-2020

Please find attached your child's homework map for this term. In addition to the homework, all children in KS1 will have reading three times a week and spellings. In KS2, the children will have reading three times a week, spellings and maths timestables. Reception children will have tub words and reading books as appropriate.

There will be a new homework map for each term and it will always be sent out at the start of term. We ask that you help your child to pick two for each term, so there will be six homework activities a year. These activities will compliment what the children are doing in the classroom. They will not be the traditional based homework tasks but encourage family-oriented activities. We will be encouraging families to talk about their child's class based learning at home.

We believe that homework is more interesting, engaging and develops multiple skills like critical thinking, creativity and an inquiring mind.

Year 6's will have some written and maths homework to support them through SATs. This will be revision questions and revision books.

The first homework will be due on Monday 14th October with the second being due on Monday 9th December.
