English

Children will be learning about environmental issues effect the world. In guided reading we will be reading Floodland by Marcus Sedgwick and exploring a range of non-fiction books to consolidate comprehension skills. In writing we will be creating a piece of contemporary fiction as well as debating climate issues through a discussion text. We will have a rap battle towards the end of term to showcase our learning.



Maths - Children will have the opportunity to learn and apply both mental and written methods in practical and real life contexts. This term the focus will be on place value, and the four operations using number with more than 4 digits. They will continue to consolidate their times table knowledge up to 12 x 12 using Times Table Rock Stars. In statistics we will be completing, reading and interpreting data in tables. In measurement we will be investigating perimeter and area in a variety of practical ways.

PE - Children will work on football and netball outdoors, and will develop their street dance skills indoors.

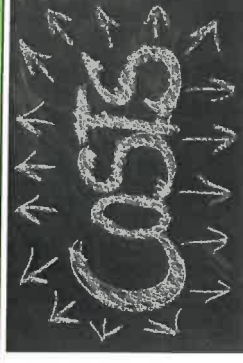
PSHE - This term children will explore relationships between family and friends.

Computing - This term the children will write their own blog on environmental issues.



French - Using vocabulary related to describing people, nationalities and telling the time. Expressing opinions about various leisure activities.

RE - Why are Rosh Hashanah, Sukkot, Harvest important? Why do Christian places of worship differ from each other? Understanding Christianity: People of God 'How can following God bring freedom and justice?'
Music - Further explore composition 'At the movies'.

Creative Curriculum

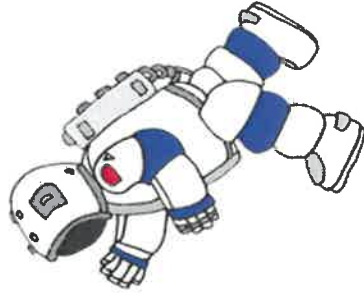
Science - This term the children will focus on investigating the 3 states of matters, explore reversible and irreversible changes and look at properties of materials.

Art/DI - In DT children will be designing and creating a sustainable lunchbox. In art children will create a sculpture using recyclable materials.

History - Using a variety of sources, children will explore and critically evaluate how the Tudors have changed England.

Geography - Children will describe and understand key aspects of human geography answering the question 'Is there enough for everyone?'

English - Children's writing will explore a variety of genres including science fiction narrative, explanation text and structured poetry all based around the Space topic. Children's writing will be inspired by their trip to the Space Centre and the space dome visiting school. Grammar will be taught alongside writing with the children being given time to write for extended periods.



Maths - Children will have the opportunity to learn and apply both mental and written methods in practical and real life contexts. The focus will be on division and multiplication, fractions, decimals and percentage, converting between these. Children will spend a lot of time looking at these areas in depth to consolidate their understanding. Children will continue to focus on their arithmetic throughout the term

PE - In outdoor PE we will be improving our fitness and stamina by doing Cross Country. In indoor PE we will be exploring handball.
PSHE - Wellbeing - my health, my life, my mind
Computing - Children will be continuing to learn about algorithms by programming a space game using scratch programmes.

French - Exploring French festivals and vocabulary related to months of the year, numbers to 60, weather and directions.

RE - Understanding Christianity: Gospel 'What would Jesus do?' Understanding Christianity: Salvation 'What did Jesus do to save human beings?'

Music - Solar System: Developing listening and compositional skills. First Access: Ukulele

Creative Curriculum

Art - In art children will combine colours, tones and tints to create images of space.

History - Researching and exploring the impact of the atomic bomb at Nagasaki

Geography - Children will investigate the geographical diversity across Europe and how countries are interconnected and interdependent.

Science - Children will explore the state of the moon, earth and sun. They will explore how day and night occur and use this to explore shadows - how they change and move. They will also consider the physics of flying and will attempt to use forces to launch a space rocket.

English - Children will be writing an adventure story, after looking at example of these in class. Following this they will write a diary from the perspective of a castaway. Linking to our history topic, this children will use what they have learnt from the Titanic to create a non-chronological report.
Guided reading session will be based around the books 'The Explorer' by Katherine Rundell and Robert Louie Stevenson's "Treasure Island".



Maths - Children will have the opportunity to learn and apply both mental and written methods in practical and real life contexts. This term, we will be focusing on geometry including angles, property of shapes and position and direction. Pupils will also be learning how to convert units of measure as well as working out the area and volume of shapes.

PE - This term athletics will be the focus in our outdoor session, whilst gymnastics will be our indoor focus.

PSHE - Children will focus on looking at 'changes' that happen to their bodies during puberty.

Computing— Pupils will be discovering how to use 3D printers and Tinkercad to create a shelter.

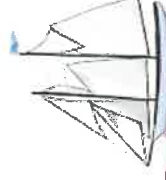
Castaway

French - Learning how to give and follow instructions and shop for food, drink and clothing. Exploring French speaking countries in the world and discussing the languages we speak.

Creative Curriculum

Geography - Using maps the children will explore topographical features, including hills, mountains and rivers. As well as investigating geographical similarities and differences

History - Children to look at a case study of the Titanic and look at the socio-economic circumstance in British history at this time.

Art - Explore work by the artist Hokusai and create an original piece influenced by this style.

DT - Children will design and create their own island, using a range of materials and tools.

Science - Pupils will be exploring living things and their habitats. They will be investigating the life cycles of both plants and animals and understanding the changes in humans from birth to old age.
