English Children will write more extended pieces of work covering a variety of genres. This will begin with a piece of suspense writing based on the text 'The Island at the end of everything'. Our other writing units will link with our WWII topic, we will be looking at Biographies— with a focus on Anne Frank. As well as creating poetry linked to the Holocaust.

Children will continue to increase their grammatical terminology throughout the term.

Maths Children will have opportunity to learn and apply both mental and written methods in practical and real life contexts. A key focus this term will be improving the children's speed and accuracy in arithmetic. In maths the subjects covered will be long multiplication, long division, percentages of an amount, comparing and ordering decimal numbers, adding and subtracting fractions and multiplying and dividing decimals.

Science Children will explore the circulatory system of the human body. They will take an in depth look at how to keep fit and healthy.

German Children will be introduced to the German language and culture. This term they will learn vocabulary related to greeting others, introducing ourselves, numbers to 20, colours and days of the week.

Music Children will explore structure, pitch and notation. Music and ICT using Garage band.

RE Jesus, his life and stories that he told will be considered. Children will investigate the Old Testament.

Creative Curriculum Throughout this term, children will gain a greater understanding of life during World War II. Aspects of this topic will include: evacuation, rationing, The Blitz and propaganda.

Children will be given the opportunity to hear accounts of life during the war as well as sharing what they have learnt with grandparents at our World War II teaparty.

Children will explore water colour washes and will create a landscape. Children will look at perspective and pen and ink drawings. They will consider the work of artists who studied the war. They will create stencilled war art.



Computing Children will be developing their programming skills and filming and editing a video.

PE Outdoor games will include rugby, hockey and netball and then indoors we will be learning to dance the Jitterbug.

PSHE Children will be learning more about relationships; for example, how to manage their own emotions and developing empathy for others.

Year 6 Curriculum Map Autumn Term 2019

English During this topic, we will write a mystical narrative focussing on an abandoned theme park— with emotive language at the centre of this. Other writing will include a newspaper report, as well as a persuasive article.

Children will continue to increase their grammatical terminology throughout the term.

TOPIC

Theme Park Maths Visit to Twinlakes

Maths This is a maths focussed topic and children will have opportunities to learn and apply both mental and written methods in practical and real life contexts. Children will then consider profit and loss at their park.

We will continue to work on improving the children's speed and accuracy in both arithmetic and reasoning.

DT and Computing Children will work on developing and building a moving theme park ride that will be a feature in their theme park. They will investigate current rides and their appeal to the public. They will then go onto design and build a attraction of their choice. Children will use computing skills to present their work to the financiers using Excel.

Creative Curriculum Children will use the internet to research theme parks around the world before creating their own. They will develop an initial idea into a brand. They will create a logo and mascot for their park. They will use a medium of their choice to create posters to persuade the public to visit their attraction.

Science Children will explore electrical circuits and draw them using scientific symbols.

Year 6 Curriculum Map Spring Term 2020

German Children will learn vocabulary related to months of the year, weather and seasons.

Music First access – children learn to play the ukulele.

RE Children will consider influences in their lives along with understanding how important Easter is around the world.

PE Gymnastics this term will involve creating a routine to include using a variety of apparatus. Children will also take part in circuit training. Outdoor PE will include increasing stamina through

PSHE Children will be developing an understanding of their own skills and talents and the importance of these when working collaboratively.



English Children will write an information text on an area which is of interest to them. We will study performance poetry. Children will have the opportunity to write and perform their own poems. We will also read famous speeches and learn how speech writers use language to build passion and momentum.

We will consolidate our knowledge of grammatical terminology in preparation for secondary school.

Computing Children will use a coding program. They will initially explore what goes into programming and create an app.

Children will continue to be equipped with the skills and knowledge to keep them safe online.

Creative Curriculum

The aim of this topic is to inspire children to want to create a better world. They will investigate how individuals, past and present, have been agents of social, geographical or political change. Children will also learn about the political and legal system in the United Kingdom.

We will explore key human, environmental and animal rights campaigns and look into how they could become champions of change themselves.

Maths Children will have the opportunity to learn and apply both mental and written methods in practical and real life contexts.

A targeted transition maths unit will be covered this term. The children will be reminded of the key skills that they will require for secondary, including the formal methods of calculation

German Children will focus on the topics of hobbies and food. Children will also explore how to express opinions and consolidate their knowledge of German.

Music Children will explore musical processes and compositions. They will also prepare for their celebration and leavers events.

RE Children will be given time to consider big questions; world poverty and wealth as well as thinking about the key points they will take to secondary with them.

PSHE Children will consider moving on—the issues and worries of secondary transfer will be considered and role play will be key to ensuring the children have a chance to share their concerns. We will also cover a unit of work on sex and relationships.

PE Indoor PE will focus on modern dance and outdoor will be athletics, in preparation for sports day.
