

Pupil Premium Covid-19 Addendum 2019/20

March 2020, saw the closure of schools for the purpose of education, however remained open for key worker children. This created an unprecedented change to the role of schools.

At William Law CE Primary, we made the decision that we would still educate pupils remotely, who were not in attendance under the key worker eligibility. When schools partially reopened on 1st June 2020 we were operating 3 forms of education. Education for; eligible year groups in EYFS, Year 1 and Year 6; key worker education and remote learning for the rest of the children who remained at home either through parental choice or lack of eligibility.

The barriers to learning increased as a result to the usual barriers that disadvantaged pupils usually face, these are listed below:

- Contact between pupil and teachers;
- Learning in school unable to resume;
- Safeguarding, wellbeing, mental health and welfare concerns;
- Increased poverty as a result of job losses;
- Social isolation as a result of lockdown;
- Transition to secondary and transition to EYFS;
- Lack of resources at home to facilitate learning.

As a result of these additional barriers as a school we have implemented the following approach to support pupils.
